What do paralegals/legal assistants do?

The term paralegal and legal assistant are often used interchangeably. Paralegals perform many functions delegated by attorneys, including but not limited to the following:

- Conduct client interviews
- Draft legal documents, correspondence and pleadings
- Summarize depositions, interrogatories and testimony
- Attend executions of wills, real estate closings, depositions, court or administrative hearings and trials with the attorney
- Locate and interview witnesses
- Conduct investigations and statistical and documentary research
- Conduct legal research
